 Actively milking cows have the option of checking in between 8:00 am and 12:00 noon on the day of their show.
Judging Day:
 Wednesday, July 26 – Ayrshire, Jersey, Lineback & Milking Shorthorn
 Thursday, July 27 – Holstein, Brown Swiss & Guernsey
Entries Released: Friday 10:00 pm
 Actively milking cows may release at 10:00 pm the night of their show

RULES

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. The following Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinary Consultation Relationship statement for the animals being exhibited must be included with a signature line on the fair registration for: "I attest and affirm that a "veterinary consultation relationship" – as that phrase is defined in the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law found at 3 Pa. C.S.A. 2501 et seq. and any amendments thereto – exists with regard to any animals I will be exhibiting." Animals entering with a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are exempt from this statement requirement. The Fair will retain copies of the Entry Forms for a period of one (1) year. If the Owner/Caretaker is under 18 years of age, the signature of a parent/guardian is required.
2. Cattle appearing to be unhealthy upon arrival including any visible signs of ringworm, warts, lice and mange, will NOT be allowed to enter the grounds.

HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1.
2. Cattle shall be identified by an official ear tag or other unique identification device approved by PDA. Official identification includes:
 - a. A USDA-issued National Uniform Ear tagging System (NUES) tag have a US shield; or

- b. A 15-digit Animal Identification Number (AIN) Ear tag starting with "840" and having a US shield; or
 - c. Other official identification approved by PDA. (Brands and breed registrations with tattoos are not acceptable). (2016)
3. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
 4. Current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

- 2. Exhibitors may only enter one (1) night. Person must be a current exhibitor in this year's fair or a direct family member (son, daughter, grandchild, niece, nephew, etc.) must be a current exhibitor,



- 3. Only breeds being exhibited that night may be shown. The animal for this class must have been entered in the Open Show on that specific night.
