Deadline: JUNE 30



All exhibitors must submit proper Health Papers* before unloading show animals.

Dept. 002, Dairy Cattle and Dept. 010 4-H Cattle

ENTRY CHECK-IN (all entries must have been pre-registered by mail or online)

HOURS *: Sunday, July 21, 7:00 pm until 10:00 pm ONLY
Monday, July 22, 8:00 am until 12:00 Noon

FEE: \$2.25 per head

RELEASE: Friday, July 26 after 10:00 pm *

* **SPECIAL NOTE** - All heifers must come Sunday or Monday. However, milking cows have the option of checking in between 8:00 am and 12:00 noon on the day of their Show. Actively milking cows can be released after 10:00 pm the night of their Show.

Dept. 004, Sheep (all breeds), Dept. 010, Market Lambs (all breeds) and Market Goats (all breeds)

ENTRY CHECK-IN (all entries must have been pre-registered by mail or online)

HOURS: Thursday, July 25, 8:00 am until 12:00 Noon ONLY

FEE: \$1.75 per head

RELEASE: Saturday, July 27 after 12:00 Noon

Dept. 006, Dairy Goats and Dept. 010, 4-H Dairy Goats

ENTRY CHECK-IN (all entries must have been pre-registered by mail or online)

HOURS: Sunday, July 21, after 7:00 pm until 10:00 pm ONLY
Monday, July 22, 8:00 am until 12:00 Noon

FEE: \$1.75 per head

RELEASE: Wednesday, July 24 after 10:00 pm or Thursday, July 25 before 10:00 am

* **"Health Papers"** - The Animal Exhibition Sanitary Law requires attestation that a Veterinary-Client-Patient-Relationship (VCPR) exists for **all animals** to be exhibited. This requirement can be fulfilled in any of the following means:

- a. A VCPR Form with veterinarian's signature - valid for one (1) year after the date signed (see Index of this book)
- b. A signed statement on the Fair's Entry Form for the animal(s) being exhibited: "I attest and affirm that a "veterinary consultation relationship" - as that phrase is defined in the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law found at 3 Pa.C.S.A. § 2501 et seq. and any amendments thereto - exists with regard to any animals I will be exhibiting."
- c. A valid Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) - valid for thirty (30) days after the date of issuance and for only one destination.

Exhibitors may present their attestation either upon arrival at the Fair, or by mailing to the Fair to expedite check-in. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases, and a statement of this should be written on the CVI. CVIs are required for out-of-state livestock.

Living-Quarter Trailer Hook-Up Fee: \$30.00 (for trailers requesting water/electric hook up)
