DAIRY CATTLE
ADULT SHOWMANSHIP**

1. Person must be 25 years of age or older.
2. Exhibitors may only enter one (1) night. Person must be a current exhibitor in this year's fair or a direct family member (son, daughter, grandchild, niece, nephew, etc.) must be a current exhibitor,
3. Only breeds being exhibited that night may be shown. The animal for this class must have been entered in the Open Show on that specific night.

SUPREME CHAMPION**

The Supreme Champion Awards are given in memory of longtime Livestock Department chairpersons Horace and Anna Wilson.

The Selection Process is as follows:

1. A Grand Champion is chosen by the Judges for each breed represented at the Show.
2. The breed Grand Champions then compete for the Supreme Champion Award.
3. The Judges select the Supreme Champion which is the "Best of Show"

SHEEP - OPEN CLASS**

Entry Fee: \$1.75 per head.
Registration Deadline: July 1
Entries Received: Thurs, July 29 8:00 am - 12:00 noon
Judging Day: Friday, July 30: all breeds
Entries Released: Saturday, July 31 after 12 Noon

RULES

1. Refer to General Rules, Livestock Health Rules & Regulations, Care Guidelines, and Code of Show Ring Ethics.
2. Each exhibitor shall be limited to two (2) entries in any one class, including individual ewe and ram classes. Each exhibitor may receive two premiums in this class. Only one group prize will be paid to any single exhibitor in a class.
3. All animals in Group Classes must be registered to the same exhibitor.
4. Market Lambs are shown in Weight Classes in 4-H/FFA Dept. 10 only. Market Lambs may be shown in Open Class Fitting and Showmanship classes.
5. If a specific breed does not have at least three (3) exhibitors with a total of 15 animals exhibited each year for two consecutive years, that breed may be dropped from the show classification the following year.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. The following Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinary Consultation Relationship statement for the animals being exhibited must be included with a signature line on the fair registration form: "I attest and affirm that a "veterinary consultation relationship" -as that phrase is defined in the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law found at 3 Pa.C.S.A. § 2501 et seq. and any amendments thereto - exists with regard to any animals I will be exhibiting." Animals entering with a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are exempt from this statement requirement. The Fair will retain copies of the Entry Forms for a period of one (1) year. If the Owner/Caretaker is under age 18 years of age, the signature of a parent/guardian is required.
2. Sheep appearing to be unhealthy upon arrival, including any visible signs of disease, will NOT be allowed to enter the grounds.
3. Individual animal identification is required for all sheep. Official ID includes:
 - a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield; or
 - b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database aka scrapie tattoo (flock ID in the right ear—state postal code and letters/numbers—and individual animal ID in the left ear); or
 - c. A breed registration tattoo if animals are accompanied by a registration certificate (copy acceptable) and the tattoo is legible.



HEALTH RECOMMENDATIONS

1. A Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) issued after May 1.
2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
3. Sheep Vaccination Requirements:
 - a. Current rabies vaccination administered by a licensed veterinarian is recommended for animals 3 months of age and older.

DEPT. 006 – SECTION 01 DAIRY GOATS OPEN CLASS

RULES

1. Refer to General Rules, Livestock Health Rules & Regulations, Care Guidelines, and Code of Show Ring Ethics.
2. The Show is not a sanctioned show.
3. Breeds may not be combined for Group Classes. Only Does entered in Age Classes may be shown in Group Classes.
4. Base date for computing age is Show Day.
5. The Fair Committee reserves the right to change unofficial breeds to "All Other Purebreds" status. Exhibitors will be notified of any changes.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

1. The following Animal Owner or Caretaker's Verification of Veterinary Consultation Relationship statement for the animals being exhibited must be included with a signature line on the fair registration form: "I attest and affirm that a "veterinary consultation relationship" –as that phrase is defined in the Animal Exhibition Sanitation Law found at 3 Pa.C.S.A. § 2501 et seq. and any amendments thereto – exists with regard to any animals I will be exhibiting." Animals entering with a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) are exempt from this statement requirement. The Fair will retain copies of the Entry Forms for a period of one (1) year. If the Owner/Caretaker is under age 18 years of age, the signature of a parent/guardian is required
2. Individual official animal identification is required for all goats. Official ID includes:
 - a. A USDA ear tag with a US shield ; or
 - b. A legible tattoo with herd and individual identification recognized in an approved USDA Scrapie database aka scrapie tattoo (flock ID in the right ear—state postal code and letters/numbers—and individual animal ID in the left ear); or
 - c. A breed registration tattoo if the animal is accompanied by a registration certificate and the tattoo is legible.
3. Goats appearing to be unhealthy upon arrival, including cases of lymphadenitis, sore mouth, active ringworm, foot rot, warts, lice, mange, and abscesses, will **NOT** be allowed to enter the grounds.

2. All animals must be free of infectious and contagious diseases and a statement of this should be written on the CVI.
